Kennedy Heights Community Council



January 30 was one of the coldest days of the year outside... but inside City Hall over 125 KH residents turned the heat up full blast on the Beverage Cave.

This was a liquor permit hearing like Cincinnati has never seen. Standing room only in the hearing room, with dozens more standing and sitting in the hallway. Finally the hearing was moved into the more spacious Council chambers.

Witnesses & Fellowship

Residents came alone and in car pools. Cornerstone Baptist Church brought a bus load.

Witness after witness told the state hearing officer their personal observations and concerns about the Cave's potential effect on litter, crime, the community plan, and overall quality of life.

One of the more memorable characterizations came from a Cornerstone member, who expressed concern about the young guys who "fellowship" in the parking lot and in the church shadows.

Cincinnati Police Officers Neville and Byers testified both about the existing crime problems in the community and about the kinds of problems that typically follow beer-wine pony kegs.

One of the more absurd moments was the Beverage Cave's accusation that KHCC had tricked the Beverage Cave owners by luring them into buying the property to get them to demolish an eyesore building—and then stabbing them in the back by opposing their license.

However, KHCC witnesses testified that we had informed the owners Jacksons weeks before they bought the property of the community's overwhelming opposition and that the residents would strenuously oppose a liquor permit.

Going Strong at 2:30 !

Testimony started at 10:00 and was still going strong when the City attorney (our side) finally called it a day—"is there anyone who has not yet spoken who **really, really** wants to testify and has something different to add?"

What Next?

The State hearing officer has returned to Columbus and will make a recommendation to the Director of Liquor Control based on the evidence presented in Cincinnati. The Director may take as long as 90 days to announce her decision.

The loser (either the City or the Cave) has an automatic right to appeal and have another hearing in Columbus. If you testified in Cincinnati, you could be asked to repeat your testimony at the Columbus hearing.

Probation Check Yields Doon Drug Bust

At the end of January, two probation officers checking on Gary Wayne Hedges (Doon Ave.) who was on probation on a prior charge, noticed a knife and drug paraphernalia in his home.

Police searched the home and found about 60 pounds of marijuana (worth about \$80,000), seven guns, a sword and a knife. Some accounts reported hundreds of pounds of marijuana.

Vice Captain Humphries said, "This removes significant amount of drugs out of the Kennedy Heights area, we hope we've made a good impact in the community, a positive impact."

Mr. Hedges faces charges for drug possession, trafficking and weapons.

A KHCC delegation met with Silverton City Council to present KHCC proposal to rebuild Silverton School on the ex-Furniture Fair property to serve both communities.

Our Community Center (aka Pleasant Ridge Community Center) is one of two in Cincinnati to be selected for a new program for people over 50 through a special grant received at the PR Recreation Center.
