# 7:45 p.m. Safety Update - Officer Monique Martin

- A. Crimes for Kennedy Heights
  - a. Robbery through social media marketplace sales. Reminder to meet people in a public area when participating in online sales.
  - b. Auto break-ins went down, so please continue to remove all valuables from vehicles.
  - c. One vehicle theft, a Kia—this has been an ongoing issue, so if you have a Kia, go to your dealer and get the mechanism fixed.
    - i. The car was ultimately found.
  - d. One burglary, was committed by a suspect known to the victim.
  - e. One incident about two weeks ago involved a non-resident visiting a friend who began shooting at people on the street.
    - i. The man was arrested, and will be receiving the mental health services he needs.

#### B. Public Questions

- a. Someone asks about the local fire and that it was committed by someone who had been in and out of jail, did anyone have comment about that?
  - i. Officer Martin was not familiar with this. There was a fire at 3922 Standish that was an unattended cooking fire.
- b. Other attendees talk about the fire they saw on Pace and hearing that it was arson.
  - i. Officers confirm there was a fire two nights ago but the cause had not been determined yet; it was still under investigation.
- c. Question about whether or not there will be stepped up patrols for Halloween
  - i. There are not enough personnel for extra patrolling; all people are occupied with the calls they receive.

#### 7:55 p.m. Safety Update: Fire, Captain Herbert

- A. Reminder to check your smoke alarms with the upcoming time change.
  - a. Change the batteries.
  - b. Press the test button; if it beeps and alerts after, you're good to go
  - c. Three out of five home fire deaths result from fires in which no smoke alarms are present.

- d. Go to the City website, click on "Fire," and there is a link you can fill out to request a free smoke alarm. Or call 513-357-5785.
  - i. They will come out and help install it.
  - ii. There are all kinds of different smoke alarm types. They all work, just in different ways. The ideal is to have one of each kind, but as long as you have any kind.
- B. Most fires are unattended cooking. Don't leave burners on if you're not going to be in the kitchen.
- C. Be cautious using space heaters—make sure everything is six feet away. And make sure

# 8:05 p.m. Community Orchard Project - Jessican Wieman

- A. Jessica and her husband have lived in Kennedy Heights for six years
- B. Learned about the nonprofit The Common Orchard a while back and put in an application to have their extra lot converted into a community orchard.
  - a. Figured it would be a great asset for the neighborhood, in line with goals of maintaining the tree canopy, and a great tool for education
- C. Common Orchard Project helps install and maintain small orchards around the city. This would be their 40th project, but also one of their largest.
  - a. Usually, their orchards are 10 trees, but this lot has room for 20-30.
    - i. They have mapped out a plan for the planting, which includes two dozen trees to be planted on November 11, 12:30 p.m. 3:30 p.m.
      - 1. 5015 Kennedy Ave
    - ii. Then in the spring, a second phase would be planting berry bushes, cherries, and perennials
  - b. It is a permaculture approach, as opposed to just rows of trees.
    - i. The plan is to have a path and signs about what everything is.
    - ii. The Common Orchard Project would supply all those materials, including deer protection and irrigation supplies, and some volunteers to help during the planting day.
    - iii. They will train Jess Wieman to take care of the orchard.
  - c. Currently, Jess has been putting a pollinator garden at the corner.
