I. January Minutes: One addition: the address of the property on Lumford PL. is 3500. Minutes were then approved with 100% ayes.

II. Fire (Lt. Ed Wallace, Engine 8): 2020 Stats - 1900 EMS runs, 189 fire runs, 41 structure fires, Response time – 1 minute 15 seconds to 1 minute 33 seconds.

- *Carbon Monoxide Detectors: don't install them in the basement or kitchen. Place them where you spend the most time: living room bedroom, family room.
- *Smoke Detectors: check them monthly.
- *Sign up for SMART 911: I is a nationwide program. Download the mobile App or use the website. By signing up, your health information is preloaded and allows first responders to help you faster. Website is <u>www.smart911.com</u>
- *House address numbers: make sure they are visible at night.
- III. Police (Off. Rice): January stats 2 burglaries, 1 aggravated menacing, 4 thefts.
 - *Shootings on Northdale PL. there is an ongoing investigation and a suspect is in custody.
 - *3500 Lumford PL. property owner is open to selling it. The KHDC is interested.
- IV. Proposed Budget for 2021 (Sr. Carren/Ramona Mayo): Budget was reviewed. A motion to accept was made by Jeffrey Weidner and 2nd by Eric Armstrong. Ayes 100%, Opposed none. Proposed Budget accepted.
- V. Neighborhood Plan Update (Mary): Planning group has met... Working Groups:
 - *Quadrant 1: working on history of the neighborhood, business district, Triangle Park, and signs on Montgomery Rd. *Quadrant 2: the leader was not on the call. Mary will follow-up with this group.
 - *Quadrant 3 (Steve Greiser): the group met recently are looking into problems with traffic on Zinsle, the Tot Lot, and the store on the corner of Zinsle and Red Bank Rd.
 - *Quadrant 4: _
